C.A.P.A was founded in 1989, a unique collaboration between the cities of Brecksville and Broadview Heights, and the Breckville-Broadview Heights School District. The association was formed to prevent and intervene in drug and alcohol abuse in the schools and larger communities.

School-Based Coalition Highlights (2008-2011)

HUDDLE (Helping Us Develop Dedication, Leadership & Enthusiasm) is a peer-to-peer mentoring program in which high school students educate 6th and 8th graders on alcohol, tobacco and other drugs while building social skills.

- ▶ 406 students have participated in HUDDLE

HUDDLE Jr. is an 8th grade peer leadership group in which students participate in school and community-based activities prompting positive decision making, while increasing their own self-esteem and resistance skills.

- ▶ 88 students have participated in HUDDLE Jr.

PREscript is a program to increase awareness of how to properly dispose of expired and unused medications and the dangers of prescription drug abuse

- ▶ 13 students involved in creation of social marketing campaign
- ▶ 5 Public Service Announcements created



Senior-Senior Prom: High School HUDDLE students and their friends participated in an inter-generational event at the Senior-Senior Prom. The event provided an opportunity to build inter-generational relationships while having fun together.

- ▶ 70 senior students and 100 senior adults impacted

Project Northland is an alcohol prevention curriculum that is being taught to all students at the Middle School by high school HUDDLE members. The program employs grade-specific tasks, exercises, and activities in a variety of formats, and includes information and activities for students to engage in with their parents.

- ▶ 1072 middle school students impacted

Project Towards No Drug Abuse (PTND) is a drug and alcohol prevention curriculum that teaches students about the dangers of substance abuse as well as helps them discover motivation factors, coping skills and decision making in the effort to help them make healthy choices in their lives.

- ▶ 1202 high school students impacted

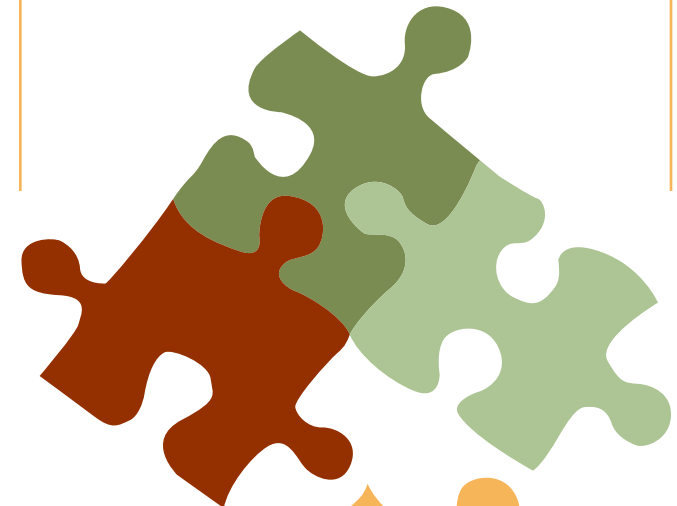
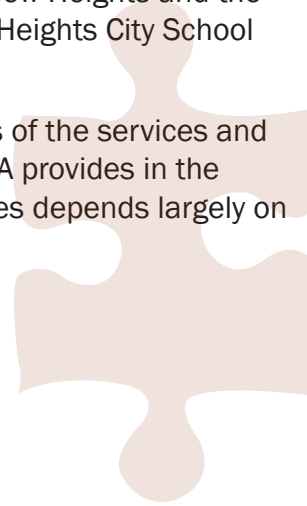
